Lastly, you'll develop an appreciation for the beauty of watercolor and gouache and watercolor and pastels and how simple it is to blend with watercolors to get stunning results.



Key Learnings

Subject: TALL PINES BY A RIVER BANK

Imagine tall pines towering on the bank, their majestic forms reaching up towards the sky, while down below, the river's rushing waters flow freely. It's a scene of natural beauty, where the solidity of the trees contrasts beautifully with the openness of the surrounding landscape. Just picture it—a serene and peaceful moment by the riverbank.

Study in Greens

Although green is commonly associated with nature, it can sometimes be intimidating to paint – depending on its hue, temperature, and intensity. To explore the world of watercolors and better understand the many shades and tones of green, I turned to QoR Modern Watercolors for this exercise. I used my standard base palette to study each color and observed how each one reacted. It's worth noting that cross-mixing colors can produce different results depending on the brand of watercolor you use. So, while my experience was with QoR, it may be different with another brand.






